8. All Articles MUST have been made or grown within the last year.

10. Entries of Perishable goods, to the Fair Grounds on Wednesday, September 8, 2010 between 2:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.

11. When Judges have made their decisions, the

Superintendent will see that awards are properly distributed.

First Premium, BLUE; Second Premium, RED; Third Premium, YELLOW. All premium money will be paid from the JUDGING SHEETS and NOT from any ribbons that may be attached to the exhibits. ALL JUDGING RESULTS ARE FINAL

12. While the Society has supervision of its buildings and grounds during the fair, it does not hold itself liable or responsible for the loss of the property of exhibitors through damage or theft.

13. ALL ENTRIES MUST be removed at DESIGNATED TIMES ONLY; Sunday 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

14. Any article not removed by 8:30 p.m. on Sunday will become the property of Hebron Harvest Fair and will be disposed of accordingly.

15. All premiums, for all departments, will be forfeited if any item is removed from grounds before the designated times.

Drop off days and times for all entries for Arts and Crafts building. All exhibits, except perishables, MUST be delivered to the fairgrounds on Tuesday Sept. 7, 2010 from 2:00 to 6:00 p.m. All exhibits for perishables must be delivered to the fairgrounds on Wed., Sept 8, 2010 from 2:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.

1. All entry blanks must be received by September 3, 2010 to permit a planned layout of exhibiting area. No walk-ins at Fair time will be allowed!
2. All exhibitors must purchase a daily or season pass, except those 12 and under, and senior citizen rate.
3. For entry of each article, a tag will be made out stating Dept. Number, Class letter and Lot number, and will remain attached to the article during the Fair. Claim checks will be provided upon entry. All Entry forms must show a Social Security Number.
4. Only one entry per Description in any one Dept. will be allowed per applicant. No substitutions will be allowed when items are delivered. Substituted items will be disqualified.
5. The Fair Committee will exercise all reasonable care of exhibits, but will not be responsible for any damage or loss which may occur.
6. In absence of competition, the withholding of premiums and ribbons will be at

the discretion of the judges. Arts and Crafts exhibits will be judged at 7:00 p.m. Tuesday, and Wednesday.

7. All premiums will be paid according to records in the Judges book. The exhibits may be removed no earlier than Sunday from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Any exhibits left on the Fair Grounds after SUNDAY EVENING will become the property of the Hebron Lions Club.

8. In making an entry, every exhibitor agrees to be governed by the rules and regulations listed for each classification.

9. No exhibit fee will be charged for Arts and Crafts exhibits.

10. Professionals are welcome to exhibit in categories other than those in which they earn a living.

11. In case of bad weather, premium money may be pro-rated.

12. IMPORTANT NOTE: Due to the great increase of exhibits, all rules will be followed as stated with no exceptions.
